Special Conditions :

1. All samples are to be consigned in secure packaging.
2. All samples must be clearly labelled and a full description of the contents of each package must be provided. On arrival in New Zealand all documents associated with the consignment will be inspected by the MPI Inspector.
3. A record is to be kept of all samples imported using this permit (including scientific name/description of the goods, country of origin and date of arrival) and the current status of the material (i.e. held/in use/destroyed). Upon request, this record must be made available to the MPI Inspector at all reasonable times.



4. Material imported under this permit to import is for analysis only. No plant material is to be propagated and no viable microorganisms are to be extracted or reconstituted from any of this material or its derivatives.
 5. The samples are to be stored and used at the transitional facility in accordance with a quality operating system approved by the inspector of the facility, and must not leave the facility without further authorisation from the Facility Inspector.
 6. Any material remaining after analysis is to be incinerated or autoclaved for disposal, unless otherwise stated in the operating system, with further authorisation from the Facility Inspector.
 7. If any conditions of this permit to import cannot be, or are not complied with, the importer may be required by the MPI Inspector to reship or destroy the imported material.
 8. Upon receipt, building and environmental samples for chemical analysis will be treated by autoclaving and/or ashing. These samples may then be treated as per other laboratory samples.
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IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PERMIT HOLDERS AND AGENTS

- 1 This permit, and compliance with the provisions of the specific import health standard(s) and/or entry conditions, does not guarantee that the goods you import will be given biosecurity clearance. There are other restrictions in sections 27 and 28 of the Biosecurity Act 1993 which apply to the giving of biosecurity clearance. The Biosecurity Act may be accessed at www.legislation.govt.nz
- 2 You will need to ensure that the goods you import comply with the provisions of the specific import health standard(s) and/or entry conditions that are applicable. The import health standard may be amended during the course of your permit. Import Management will notify you of any significant changes to the import health standard and will re-issue the permit to accommodate these changes.
- 3 There are a number of other provisions in the Biosecurity Act 1993 which may affect you. If you commit an offence against the Biosecurity Act 1993, heavy penalties under section 157 of the Act might apply.
- 4 Apart from the Biosecurity Act 1993, there are other laws relating to or prohibiting the importation of goods. This permit, and compliance with the provisions of the specific import health standard(s) and/or entry conditions, does not absolve you of the need to comply with these laws.
- 5 Unless specifically identified in 'Description of Items' or 'Special Conditions' of the permit, NO new organisms, including genetically modified organisms, are permitted entry under this permit.
- 6 All cultures must be:
 - clearly labelled with the scientific strain and name
 - consigned in leakproof packaging
 - free from contaminants
- 7 All new organisms must not be opened until received by the nominated containment facility.
