Special Conditions :

1. Plant material must be imported in accordance with the import health standard, "Dried and preserved plant material and plant material for research". The standard is available at the following website:

2. The plant material has been assessed and is eligible for import under Part 5.3 of the "Dried and preserved plant material and plant material for research" import health standard.

3. Soil and water samples must be imported in accordance with the import health standard, "Soil, rock, gravel, sand, clay, and water". The standard is available at the following website:

4. Commercial PCR/DNA test kits must be imported in accordance with the import health standard, "Biological products (including samples)". The standard is available at the following website:

5. Commercial PCR/DNA test kits have been assessed to be goods with a negligible risk and are eligible to receive biosecurity clearance on arrival in New Zealand.

6. Building and environmental samples that are within the scope of goods covered by the import health standard, "Soil, rock, gravel, sand, clay, and water" must be imported in accordance with that import health standard, which is available at the following website: <https://www.biosecurity.govt.nz/dmsdocument/1651>

NOTE: Building and environmental samples that are not within the scope of the import health standard, "Soil, rock, gravel, sand, clay, and water" or another applicable import health standard may be eligible for clearance or direction to a transitional facility subject to biosecurity inspector authority.

7. Direction to the transitional facility listed on this permit is required for plant material and soil and water samples.

8. Primary packages of plant material and soil and water samples must only be opened in the transitional facility listed on this permit.

9. All documentation must be attached to consignments in such a way that the primary packaging does not have to be opened to access the documents.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PERMIT HOLDERS AND AGENTS

- 1 This permit, and compliance with the provisions of the specific import health standard(s) and/or entry conditions, does not guarantee that the goods you import will be given biosecurity clearance. There are other restrictions in sections 27 and 28 of the Biosecurity Act 1993 which apply to the giving of biosecurity clearance. The Biosecurity Act may be accessed at www.legislation.govt.nz
- 2 You will need to ensure that the goods you import comply with the provisions of the specific import health standard(s) and/or entry conditions that are applicable. The import health standard may be amended during the course of your permit. Import Management will notify you of any significant changes to the import health standard and will re-issue the permit to accommodate these changes.
- 3 There are a number of other provisions in the Biosecurity Act 1993 which may affect you. If you commit an offence against the Biosecurity Act 1993, heavy penalties under section 157 of the Act might apply.
- 4 Apart from the Biosecurity Act 1993, there are other laws relating to or prohibiting the importation of goods. This permit, and compliance with the provisions of the specific import health standard(s) and/or entry conditions, does not absolve you of the need to comply with these laws.
- 5 Unless specifically identified in 'Description of Items' or 'Special Conditions' of the permit, NO new organisms, including genetically modified organisms, are permitted entry under this permit.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PERMIT HOLDERS AND AGENTS

- 6 All cultures must be:
- clearly labelled with the scientific strain and name
 - consigned in leakproof packaging
 - free from contaminants
- 7 All new organisms must not be opened until received by the nominated containment facility.
